

1952-2000















Asbestos Use in Canada and New Cases of Mesothelioma in Ontario and British Columbia



New cases of mesothelioma in men in Canada from 1984 to 2003.



Asbestos-Related Cancers in Canada

- There are as many as 500 mesotheliomas diagnosed each year
- Based on estimates from epidemiologic studies there are 1300-2100 lung cancers each year
- Asbestos has also been associated with larynx, ovary, pharynx, stomach, and colorectal cancer
 - ⇒ Asbestos may be responsible for at least 2000 new cancers each year in Canada, mostly fatal.






